Dear Parents:

The Staff of Iqra Academy and its Board of Directors request that you and your family attend our Iqra Awareness Dinner, Saturday evening May 8, 2010, beginning at 6 pm. This event has been organized by the Iqra Board of Directors and Iqra Academy staff, to introduce the everyday functioning of our school to the community. We hope this event will provide you with a glimpse of our day-to-day life at Iqra, the results of the work we do, and an opportunity to see what the school board has in mind for the future of the school. We are very much looking forward to the pleasure of your company, in celebrating our teachers' efforts and your children's accomplishments.

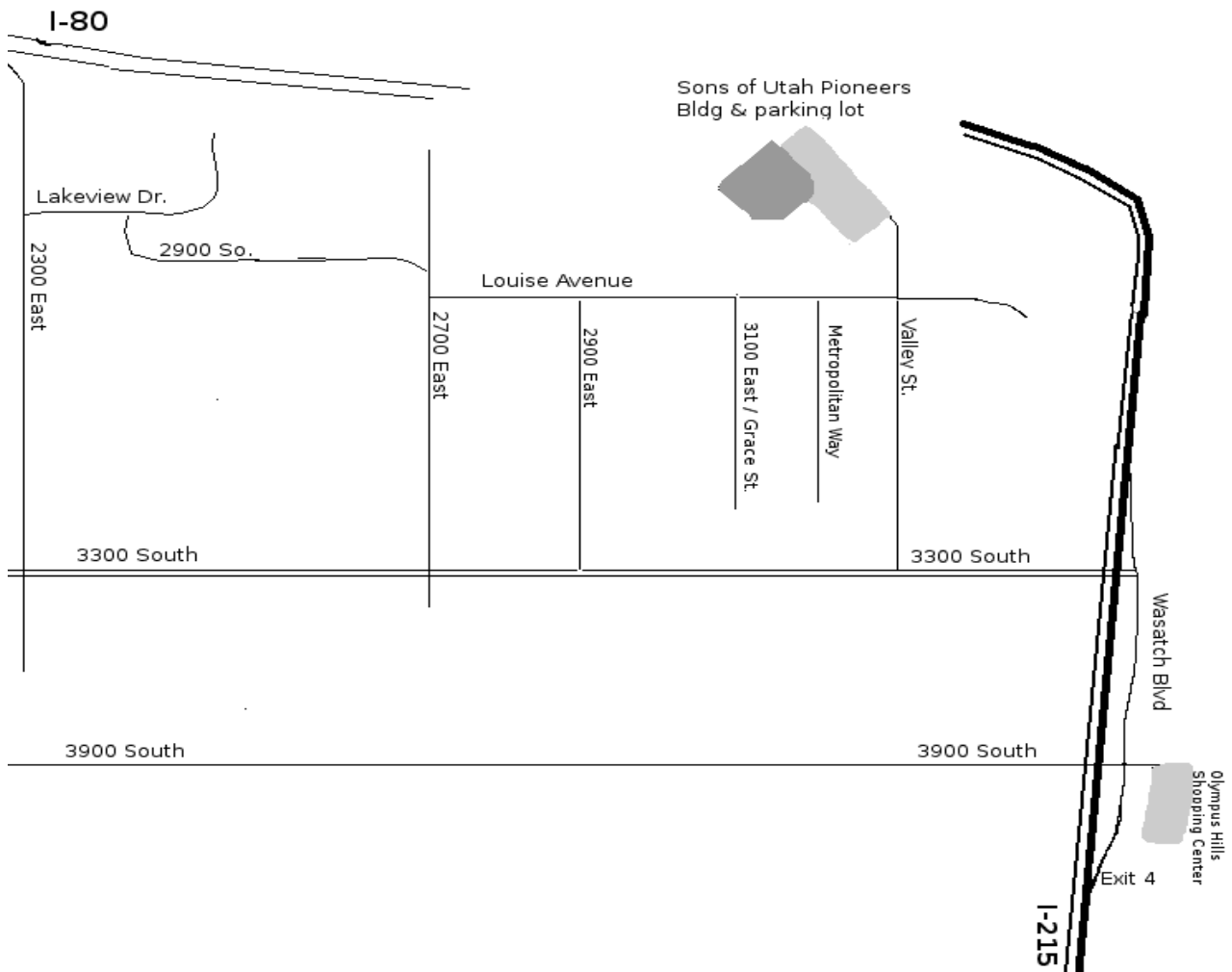

From I-80 (eastbound):

1. Take exit 127 onto **2300 East** (heading south); go 0.5 miles;
2. Turn left (east) at **Lakeview Drive** (2860 South); go only 0.1 mile, then
3. Take the first right onto **2900 South** (which goes south then curves to the east).
4. Stay on 2900 South until you reach **2700 East** (0.4 mi)
5. Turn right (south) onto 2700 East, then *almost immediately* (100 ft) turn left onto **Louise Avenue** (2920 South).
6. Follow Louise Avenue to **Valley Street** (3300 South) (0.7 mi);
at that intersection you'll see the entrance to the parking lot on your left (north).

From I-215 (northbound along the east side)

1. From I-215 (northbound), take exit 4 (3900 South / Wasatch Blvd); (0.2 mi)
2. Keeping left at the fork, follow signs for Wasatch Blvd/ 3300 So./ 3900 So. and merge onto Wasatch Blvd (1.2 mi)
3. Turn left at 3300 South / UT-171, to go west (0.3 mi).
4. Take the first street to the right: Valley Street (3300 E.), to go north (0.5 mi)
5. When you reach Louise Ave (2920 S.), the entrance to the parking lot should be straight ahead.
